- 1. (a) 'Mumps' is a singular noun, so 'is' will be used in place of 'are' to correct the sentence.
- 2. (c) 'His' is incorrectly used in the sentence. It should be replaced by 'one's'.

- 4. (b) 'Vaunt' is a synonym for boast and skewer is a synonym for criticise.
